Second Sunday of Advent

The Prophets

Today we recall the Old Testament prophets. The Creed tells us that God 'has spoken through' them. What is it that God has said?

People who study the Bible in modern times have seen the prophets as important because of their message of *judgement*. The prophetic movement started with Amos in the eighth century BC and continued through Hosea, Micah, Isaiah, and Jeremiah down to the great Exile of the Jews to Babylonia (roughly modern Iraq) in the sixth. From around 550 BC other prophets, such as Ezekiel, Haggai, and Zechariah, began to predict better times, but still concentrated on God's concern for contemporary behaviour and contemporary politics. It's this social and political focus in prophecy that has spoken most to the church for the last century and more. A preacher or leader who's 'prophetic' is one who challenges us—a critic of the state of the world or of the church, with a vision of how God wants things to improve.

Early Christians knew that the prophets had been social critics. But what interested them more was this: the prophets had foreseen events that for them still lay in the future, but in the experience of the disciples of Jesus were happening *now*. As St Paul put it, in today's reading from his letter to the Christians in Rome, 'Whatever was written in former days was written for *our* instruction'. The message of *blessing beyond judgement* recorded in Scripture (meaning what we call the Old Testament) was coming true today. Jesus was the embodiment of the hope the prophets had been inspired by. So their words had a meaning deeper than they knew themselves. Soon Jesus' followers came to believe that *all* the books of Scripture were prophetic in this sense.

It's because of that belief we still read so many texts from the Old Testament in Advent. For Christians the old words form new patterns in the mind, and speak—beyond anything the original speakers or writers could consciously have imagined—of God's revelation of his nature, and his plans for the salvation of the human race, in Jesus Christ.
