Church services

On Sundays our main service is a 10.30am Sung Eucharist. There is also a 10.30am Communion every Wednesday. The church is open for visitors and private prayer on weekdays from 10am till 3pm.

Children and young people

Families with babies and young children enjoy the play area near the main door, a safe space with toys and books. Our other groups go to the parish centre during part of the 10.30 service.

Junior Church for 3–8-year-olds enjoy Bible stories, games, songs and craft. In Quest children aged 8 and upwards explore the readings or theme of the day through activities and discussion. Senior Quest, for teenagers aged 14 upwards, meet monthly to consider a topical issue from the Christian perspective.
